What an exciting Term 4 it has been in the Wallabies room!

As many of our children prepare to transition to primary school, there have been numerous discussions about school life, particularly with orientation days taking place throughout the term. It has been truly heartwarming to hear the children express their excitement as they look forward to this next step in their journey.

Providing various games that require turn-taking, sharing and negotiation has been on high rotation this year, enhancing valuable skills that the wallabies will benefit from as they transition into school and pre-prep.

Sensory play has been a standout feature in our room this term. The children have been enjoying activities such as making playdough, cloud dough, and potions. These experiences have given them an opportunity to self-regulate, and engage in calming, solitary activities that promote their wellbeing.

Outcome 3.1: Children become strong in their social and emotional wellbeing

In the art area, we've continued to focus on process art, encouraging the children to explore the creative journey rather than focusing on an end product. From bubble art and marble painting to box construction and various resources as paint stampers, these activities have allowed the children to immerse themselves in the artistic process and truly express their creativity. It's been so exciting to see their skills and imaginations grow throughout the year!

Outcome 4: Children are confident and involved learners

It's been such a joy to watch the children in the Wallabies room grow and develop over the past year. Narelle and I want to extend a heartfelt thank you to all of our families for your ongoing support and feedback. What a beautiful and busy term. To see out all of the wonder that has been our 2024 First Year of Kinder Program. Andrea, Julie, Lani, Lee, Kaz and Mel all feel tremendously grateful for the support we have received from the families as we have had the privilege to watch the children learn and grow in all developmental areas over the year. They absolutely blew us away with their enthusiasm, confidence and innate desire to learn.

As the children have felt supported and secure in expressing their own identities, they too have felt confident to express their needs, seek out peers with similar interests and to contribute to shared play and learning experiences. These ever evolving social connections will hold the children in good stead as they transition into their Pre-Prep Kinder groups in 2024.

This term has been packed with exciting incursions in our kindergarten space. As we eased back into Term 4, we were visited by Animals of Oz, who brought a variety of Australian animals for the children to see and touch. Some of the animals that visited included a Squirrel Possum Glider, a Green Tree Frog, a Blue Tongue Lizard, a Kookaburra, a Dingo, a Saltwater Crocodile, and a Carpet Python. The children had the chance to learn about these animals, discovering where they live and what they eat.

Next, "Recycleman" came to visit, bringing his recycling superpowers to the classroom. He flew in with high-fives and had everyone laughing in no time. "Recycleman" shared how happy he feels when we put the right items in the recycling bin, highlighting how it helps protect the planet. During this interactive session, all the First Year Kindergarten children became recycling superheroes, donning green capes and using their newfound knowledge to sort various recyclable items.

We also had the chance to get out and engage with the community by taking a walk to our local library at Berninniet for a special storytime session with Becky or Ali. This outing was a fantastic opportunity for the children to connect with the wider community, and they thoroughly enjoyed the experience of listening to stories in a new environment. Thank you to our parent helpers during our excursions. Your participation was greatly appreciated. We look forward to strengthening this relationship with the library in 2025 for your child's 2025 kinder year and plan to take part in even more community-based activities in the future. This experience has inspired us to consider additional outings and collaborative events for the developing years of kindergarten that will further enrich the children's learning and connect them with the local community.

Seals, Koalas, Penguins & Bilbies

Term 4 has been a busy one for both children, families and educators alike in the Pre-Prep Kindergarten program with all children regularly participating in their school's individual transition programs, children and families working hard together during dance rehearsals and performances as well as their team sports grand finals, and educators have been writing Transition Learning and Development Statements {TLDS} for each child heading off to school in 2025. All of this whilst still planning for, providing and actively engaging in all the wonderful experiences that kindergarten affords young minds, bodies and spirits.

(EYLF 2 - Community)

Throughout the term we have continued our visits to, and use of the school grounds for gym and library visits. Exploration of, and engagement in risky play using the different playgrounds to provide safe spaces to experiment with height and distance as we develop individual skills and abilities, and prepare children to navigate the larger open spaces school offers them.

(EYLF 1, 3 & 4 - Identity, Wellbeing & Learning)

Each kinder program draws on the interests and current strengths and needs, as well as knowledge of the children within it. As such, activities and experiences offered in each space differ somewhat, but a consistent pattern has emerged throughout term 4 - across each group there has been a surge of interest in reading, drawing and writing. These are key ways many children express their thoughts, feelings and ideas, and explore concepts in their world. To facilitate this each group continually ensures there are both open ended and intentionally focused opportunities and time for children to engage in such play during each kindergarten session.

(EYLF 1 & 5 - Identity & Communication)

"RecycleMan" was a highlight of the term when he visited each group to help us learn why, how and what recycling does for our world, its people and wildlife. This, fun and highly interactive incursion empowered children to not only care for their world, but fosters their belief in themselves that they can influence and change things in and for their world, now and into the future (EYLF 2 & 4 - Community & Learning)

As we all celebrate the final PIELC newsletter for 2025, and look forward to Christmas and the summer break, for some of you this is the end of your partnership with us all here at PIELC as you and your child look ahead to the start of their school journey. Whilst this is an exciting period in your child's life it may also be a slightly anxious time but here are just a few tips to help you and your child navigate the myriad of feelings you might experience

- Read books about starting school check out the local library (they also often school holiday free activities)
- Have regular 'lunch box days' where children practice opening and eating their own lunch, can also build familiarity and excitement
- If your child's school gates are open have a play on the playground or oval, or go for a
 walk/drive up the driveway and talk about where they get off or meet the school bus
- Engage in open communication with your child talk about their feelings and concerns
 regarding their transition to school, this will help them feel secure and understood.
 Encourage them to express their feelings and concerns as this lets them know that it's
 normal to feel anxious or excited during these times
- Foster a positive attitude towards the new school, and highlight the exciting aspects of the new school, such as new friends, activities, and learning opportunities
- Once school begins it is important to establish good attendance patterns for your child and talk to the school early about any issues that may arise and impact this - they have support strategies that may assist your family
- Develop family routines at home to support your child's learning at school e.g. read with your child each night, help them with any homework etc

The Pre-Prep Kindergarten team wishes each and every one of you a very Merry Christmas, a safe and Happy New Year, and of course the very best of wishes to those children starting school in 2025. We are so very proud to have been a part of your life journey so far, we know you will continue to grow and learn and become exactly who you are meant to be - "You're one of a kind, and it's so clear to see: The world needs who you were made to be."
